## Lloyds Infinite Foundation celebrates 78<sup>th</sup> Independence Day with zeal



### LIF 2.0

The team of Lloyds Infinite Foundation has been actively carrying out initiatives under healthcare, education, skill development, employment, income generation and infrastructure sectors in the areas it is serving. Some of the recent initiatives that have been carried out with the support of local people are.

### Healthcare

Inauguration of STRC Vaidya Chikitsalaya at Lloyds Kali Ammal Memorial Hospital, Hedri has opened doors to offering the best of both healthcare methods at one single place – Modern medicine and Traditional plant-based treatment. The LKAM Hospital team is actively working to provide health checkup services at the camps being conducted under the ambit of Gadchiroli Police at various AOPs like Hedri and Surjagarh.

### Employment

Massive recruitment is ongoing for women coming under the jurisdiction of Gram Panchayats - Pursalgondi, Todsa and Nagulwadi villages, and Police AOP - Gatta, Wangeturi, Gardewada, Kandoli Burgi, Pipli Burgi for Sewing Machine Operator job role at Lloyds Vanya Clothing Co., Hedri. The Embroidery and modern laundry sections have been started. The team of Lloyds Vanya is working wholeheartedly to fulfill its' first client order.

### Skill Development

A total of 153 people from nearby project-affected villages of Surjagarh Iron Ore Mines were counselled and recruited for Mason and Bar Bending training at Umred, Nagpur. The training was conducted from 1st June 2024 to 30th August 2024. Lloyds Kaushalya Kendra was inaugurated at Anturla Fata, Ghugus, Chandrapur with a focus on fostering skill development and empowering local youth. The centre will initially offer training in Electrician and Mechanic-cum-Fitter job roles, and plans to expand from its current batch size of 40 to over 200 students in the coming months.

### Women Empowerment

In a first to promote increased role of women in core mining and mechanical operations of a mine, 15 women were selected for Excavator Operator training. The training was held at L&T Construction & Mining Machinery's Central Training Centre, Kanchipuram from 13th May to 2nd June 2024. They are presently undergoing On-the-Job training at LMEL's Surjagarh Iron Ore Mines. The first batch of 15 female security guards passed out of the Security Training Academy, Hedri on 26th June 2024, after a rigorous 36-days training and currently they are posted at CSR Complex, Hedri manning various institutions like school, hospital, garment unit and offices effectively.

### Recognition of our CSR Work

In recognition of the work done by Lloyds Infinite Foundation as a part of its' Corporate Social Responsibility, we are honoured to have received the GMF Golden Petals Awards and Ek Kaam Desh Ke Naam awards. These awards reaffirm our commitment to bringing the real change and strive towards the betterment of our people and the region.

### Education

School books and other school essentials distribution drive were organized at Konsari and Ghugus, benefiting many students. New School Building and Dining Hall has been inaugurated at Zilla Parishad Primary Center School, Konsari benefitting around 150 students. Lloyds Raj Vidya Niketan School at Hedri village, Etapalli taluka, Gadchiroli district and G.D. Goenka Lloyds Public School at Mhatara Devi, Chandrapur, equipped with modern facilities and best of teachers has opened its' doors to offer quality, value-based education. Post the successful 1st batch of Curtin University program, the selection process has been completed for the 2nd batch of students, who will be starting their training soon.

### Sports

The Sports Team in the last three months have won a cumulative 67 medals across various sports at District, State and National level tournaments. Three of our students have been selected in Gadchiroli Police Constable exam, marking a significant chapter and a proud moment for our team.

# Empowering Rural Communities

## CSR Initiatives in Surjagarh and Beyond

The Armed Outpost (AOP) in Surjagarh recently hosted a successful Shetkari Krushi Melawa, aimed at empowering local farmers. Attended by the Income Generation Activity team from Lloyds Infinite Foundation (LIF) and several prominent figures including Agriculture Officer Dongare and Sarpanchs from Todasa and Pursalgondi, the event attracted enthusiastic participation from villagers. State government initiatives supporting local farmers were discussed, and farm-related equipment and seeds were



distributed by AOP. LIF outlined upcoming agriculture initiatives to further assist the farming community.

### Beekeeping Initiative in Surjagarh and Godeli

To promote economic growth, a beekeeping initiative will be launched this September in Surjagarh and

Godeli villages under the CSR program. Seven farmers from both villages were selected to receive honey bee boxes and training, equipping them with skills to start sustainable beekeeping businesses. The initiative aims to boost local income and foster economic development.



### Bamboo Sapling Distribution in Petha, Karampalli, and Pusumpalli

In an effort to restore forests and provide future income opportunities, 60 bamboo saplings were distributed to farmers in Petha and Karampalli. In Pusumpalli, saplings were planted, and villagers were educated on bam-

boo's diverse uses, including furniture, food, fuel, and clothing. This initiative supports both environmental sustainability and local economic upliftment.

### Promoting Kitchen

### Gardening in Surjagarh & Manger

A seed distribution initiative was launched in Surjagarh and Manger villages to encourage

kitchen gardening. Seeds were distributed to 52 women, promoting home-grown produce and offering potential income opportunities through the sale of surplus vegetables. This initiative enhances food security and empowers local women.

### Swachhata Abhiyaan and Mango Plant Distribution in Mallampahadi

Our recent Swachhata Abhiyaan in Mallampahadi village focused on improving hygiene and sustainability. Residents participated in a cleanliness drive, and mango plants were distributed to enhance green spaces and provide future income sources. This initiative reflects the foundation's commitment to community health and environmental sustainability.



## Nukkad Natak - Taking Awareness to the Streets!

Lloyds Infinite Foundation's talented Konsari CSR team and artists took to the streets of Konsari, Umri, Chandankhed, Kadholi, and Rampur villages to raise awareness about epidemic diseases and addiction through engaging street plays! In the era of social media, street plays still have an important role in today's village life in taking up important societal issues and effectively conveying to the people. Popularly called Nukkad Natak, it has played a very important role, especially in Rural India in connecting people with the prevalent issues.

Our team has been effectively taking up the important topics of superstition, social stigmas, awareness on healthcare, education and skill development across many villages like Gatta, Alenga, Adange, Tadguda, Nender, Hedri, Titoda, Jambhiya and many others, which are naxal-affected, tribal areas of Etapalli taluka in Gadchiroli district since last few months. These remote areas have largely remained underdeveloped and are still devoid of basic facilities. The Street Play team has been successful in connecting

with the people and effectively conveying the message. Lloyds Infinite Foundation, under its CSR initiative, has created hospital, school, garment unit facilities at Hedri village, Etapalli taluka, along with other infrastructure and income generation facilities for the benefit of local villages. Local people over the years have certain preconceived perceptions about these modern facilities and have still belief in the orthodox practices.

To ensure betterment of people and to make them part of the modern, developed society while upholding their tradition and culture, has been the aim of LIF. To take this information to the people and to break them free from the shackles of underdevelopment, we believed street plays as a powerful tool to bridge the gap and convey important messages directly to communities. The villagers also reciprocated equally well and came out in large numbers, proving that entertainment can be a powerful tool for education and empowerment. We're committed to using impactful and engaging methods to create positive change in our society!

## Transforming Villages through Infrastructure Development

Etapalli taluka located in the southern part of Gadchiroli district, inspite of having rich natural resources has been facing the issue of underdevelopment since last many decades. The citizens were bereft of even the basic facilities. When we started our operations at Surjagarh Iron Ore Mines, it started with developing basic infrastructure amenities at nearby villages to facilitate and improve the lives of the people.

Basic infrastructure works included road construction, handpumps, overhead water tanks, community taps, ponds and wells rejuvenation, schools and community halls redevelopment, street lights installation, library, computer lab and many more.

The pond rejuvenation at Manger village is fast progressing and will soon become the picturesque spot for locals to enjoy their leisure time. In addition, Lloyds Infinite Foundation along with LMEL team and



other stakeholders are working on other infrastructure projects at different villages. To supply uninterrupted water, bore drilling has been done at 5 villages namely Hedri, Godeli, Itulnar, Pursalgondi and Alenga.

For facilitating villagers, especially women, new hand pumps have been installed for drinking water at 4 villages namely Hedri, Godeli, Itulnar and Alenga.

Based on the request from villagers, connection from our installed Over Head Water Tank (10 kL) to Government drinking water pipeline has been provided at Jharewada village. Similarly, to prevent water leakage and to ensure uninterrupted water to villagers, repair and maintenance work of drinking water handpumps have been done at Hedri village (3 handpumps) and Manger village (1 handpump). Additionally, to ensure all time accessible to good quality, potable water to villagers, RO plant will be installed. The work of two iron structures for construction of RO treatment plant shed at Manger and Mallampahadi villages has been completed.

The way to the development of a region is through quality infrastructure. We are sure that through these works, the accessibility, economy and related aspects of these remote regions will flourish in the coming years.

## Roots of Change: Our Green Initiatives

As a part of our organization's commitment towards the nature and the local ecosystem, plantation drives at each of our locations, Surjagarh, Konsari and Ghugus are being carried out extensively. This Environment Day, our entire team took a 'Green Pledge' to plant and nurture the green cover. With a theme of 'Land Restoration, Desertification & Drought Resilience', plantation drive was conducted at Bande River Side Camp and Mango Plantation was carried out at Aldandi village in Etapalli taluka. The event saw participation of local villagers, children, forest officials and out team.

To celebrate this occasion, Environment Week was celebrated by LIF team at villages. Over 50 talented young artists participated in a painting competition organized at Ekra Khurd village. Their passion for our planet shone brightly on their canvases, with the children bringing out their version of the nature's beauty through art. The winners were felicitated on World Environment Day by our esteemed chief guests, with the people cheering and motivating the young artists. Let's all continue to nurture the artistic voices of our future and protect the environment they so beautifully depict.

We believe that the environment initiatives should continue throughout the year, and we should all be indebted to the nature for its offerings. Gadchiroli, being a nature's delight and major population dependent on forests for their livelihood, the people here have great concern for the local flora. We, as an organiza-



tion resonate the same value for the environment, and many initiatives like installation of solar panels, electric vehicles usage at mines, regular sprinkling of water at mines location, dedicated truck washing system etc. are being carried out, not merely as an environmental compliance but our commitment towards ecology and sustainable practices.







# Empowering Local Youth: Inauguration of Lloyds Kaushalya Kendra



The Lloyds Kaushalya Kendra (Skill Centre) was inaugurated at Anturla Fata, Ghugus, Chandrapur with a focus on fostering skill development and empowering local youth. The inauguration was graced by Hon. Vinay Gowda (IAS), District Collector of Chandrapur, Mr. Bhaiyaji Yerame, Assistant Commissioner of the District Skill Center, and Mr. Pawan Meshram, Vice President-HR of Lloyds Metals and Energy Limited (LMEL).

The center will initially offer training in Electrician and Mechanic-cum-Fitter job roles, aiming to provide accessible, quality education to create a skilled workforce. With plans to expand from its current batch size of 40 to over 200 students, the Kaushalya Kendra is set to significantly contribute to Chandrapur's economic growth. In his address, District Collector Vinay Gowda highlighted the vital role of skill development in today's economy and praised the initiative's potential to uplift local youth and create sustainable job opportunities. Mr. Pawan Meshram from LMEL expressed the company's commitment to community development and corporate social responsibility, emphasizing the center's role as a beacon of hope and progress for the region's youth.



## Our Community Connectors

The key to success of any initiative is Team Work. When it comes to making an actual impact and difference in people's lives through our Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) projects, the on-ground team, whom we refer to as 'Outreach Workers (ORWs)' are the major contributors. The 27 ORWs located across our 10 Outreach Centres (ORCs) in villages - Kudri, Nagulwadi, Karampalli, Petha, Ekra Khurd, Bande, Hedri, Surjagad, Pursalgoni and Alenga, serve 21 villages across 3 Gram Panchayats.

The role of our ORWs is diverse and dynamic in nature. As per the number of villages under them, the respective ORCs have 2-3 ORWs working under each centre. Whenever any villager faces any issue, some information to know, some assistance needed or has some request to put in, he/she can simply walk in to the nearest ORC, and the team offers full support and takes necessary action. The villager's request along with his/her details are documented properly, so that they can be tracked and resolved in an effective and time-bound manner. Similarly, whenever ORWs take regular tour of the villages, they note down the points for further action to be taken up. They are an absolute asset in reaching to people, especially senior citizens, pregnant ladies and divyangs. ORWs play a pivotal role in the implementation and success of any initiative. There are several instances where ORWs have gone out of their job role and put in the efforts -



Whenever there is an urgent need of medical assistance and ambulance in the villages, the ORWs coordinate with the CSR and Lloyds Kali Ammal Memorial Hospital team to ensure timely medical intervention. Similarly in case of pregnant women ANC cases, accidents, ORWs are at the forefront to coordinate and ensure medical facilities for the needy. The CSR team has started an initiative wherein bus services have been started for villages as per the pre-decided schedule and villagers intending to come to hospital for checkups and consultation can avail the facility. ORWs pass this information at their respective villages and coordinate in case of any assistance required. These activities have time and again been done effectively, thanks to the efforts put in by our ORWs.

Lloyds Vanya Clothing Co.'s scope of operations and orders are increasing with each passing day. To cater to this, there is requirement of additional women workforce from local villages. ORWs propagate this information in the villages regarding this opportunity for skilling and employ-

ment for women, and the benefits associated with working here. They assist in collecting the forms of candidates through ORCs and also assist in the verification process, wherever required. Whenever there are absenteeism issues, with the help of ORWs the CSR team undertakes visit of each of the household to know the reason, counsel and take corrective steps. Some of the villages are really far and in absence of proper roads and intermittent streams especially in monsoon, people are forced to take a long walk upto the villages. To assist the CSR team and to counsel the ladies to reduce absenteeism and return back to work, the ORWs went beyond their duty and on a regular basis undertook this drive for many villages overcoming hurdles and beyond their working hours. Regular training is carried out for ORWs to enhance their skills. For Lloyds Raj Vidya Niketan School at Hedri, ORWs did the ground work in explaining to villagers about the facilities and education in the school, and filling out the forms for the students. ORWs assist students in enrolling at Lloyds Sports Academy by visiting villages and providing information about the academy's facilities, sports camps, and activities. They also conduct door-to-door surveys, both online and offline, to help implement government schemes and are invaluable in reaching remote areas. Additionally, ORWs play a key role in new CSR initiatives by identifying beneficiaries and monitoring progress in the villages.

## The Story of Our Outreach Worker- Ms. Amisha Pungati

Outreach Workers (ORWs) are the backbone of Lloyds Infinite Foundation's CSR initiatives, serving as the bridge between the organization and 21 project-affected villages. Their dedication ensures the successful implementation of healthcare, education, and employment opportunities, empowering local communities.

Ms. Amisha Pungati, an ORW from Petha village, shares her inspiring journey. Struggling with financial hardships and barely managing two meals a day, she faced an uncertain future after completing her 12th grade. When approached by officials from Surjagarh Iron Ore Mines with a job opportunity, Amisha hesitated but found courage in seeing other local girls stepping out of their comfort zones.

Today, Amisha confidently works as part of the CSR survey team, personally visiting villages to address the needs of her community. Her determination has not only transformed her own life but also inspired other girls in her village to seek opportunities be-



yond their homes.

Thanks to her role, Amisha has lifted her family out of poverty, gained financial stability, and fulfilled her dream of owning a vehicle. She expresses her gratitude to Lloyds Metals Surjagarh Project and the CSR team for the opportunities that have reshaped her life and brought happiness to her family.

Amisha's story is a testament to the power of community-driven initiatives, and her journey reflects the positive impact that Lloyds Infinite Foundation is making across these villages.





# Expansion of Education and community initiatives in Eastern Vidarbha region

## Chandrapur: G D Goenka Lloyds Public School Opens

This collaboration with the G D Goenka group, renowned for its educational excellence, features a state-of-the-art campus with green spaces, Wi-Fi, modern libraries, and labs. Plans are underway to expand the school to Class XII, focusing on holistic development and ethical leadership.



## Konsari: Revitalized School Facilities

## Empowering Tomorrow's Leaders: LIF's Educational Endeavor

As a part of our initiative at Zilla Parishad High School and Junior College, Konsari, distributing free textbooks to 137 students from classes 9 to 12. The event, attended by key figures such as Mr. Chandrasekhar Rao Voora and Mr. Mahadev Madavi, emphasized LIF's commitment to enhancing educational access. This initiative marks the beginning of further support, including the distribution of school accessories.

Additionally, LIF celebrated International Chess Day at LRVN School, Hedri, and ZP School, Konsari, with chess activities aimed at fostering critical thinking and strategic skills. These efforts highlight LIF's dedication to both academic support and extracurricular development, shaping a brighter future for the students of Gadchiroli.

## Konsari: New Computer Training Center Inaugurated

On April 27, 2024, a computer training center was inaugurated in Konsari village. The center, equipped with six computers, will train 36 students in batches of six over three-month periods. The inaugural event was attended by Sarpanch Srikant Pavde, Upsarpanch Ratan Akkewar, Director-CSR Kirthy Reddy, and other local dignitaries. Certificates will be awarded to students upon successful completion of the training, marking a significant step in enhancing digital literacy in the region.

## Etapalli: Launch of School Bus Services

In partnership with Lloyds Metals & Energy Ltd. and Etapalli Nagar Panchayat, we introduced a school bus service to address transportation challenges faced by students commuting from Etapalli to Alapalli. The bus was inaugurated by Nagar Panchayat President Mrs. Dipayanti Pendam and Lloyds Metals Executive Director Mr. S. Venkateswaran. This initiative aims to ensure timely and comfortable commutes, improving educational access for local students. The launch was celebrated by local dignitaries including Etapalli Sub-Divisional Police Officer Mr. Chaitanya Kadam and Block Development Officer Mr. Adinath Andhale.



## Internship students share their experience of Community Engagement

Guided by local tribals Reshma Lalu Gundru and Nirmala Vija Pungati, we explored Hedri village, gaining an appreciation for the Madia people's deep bond with the forest, which is reflected in their language and daily practices. Madia tribe's rich cultural heritage was evident in their skilled craftsmanship, such as the intricate weaving of bamboo baskets and the sustainable production of leaf plates. Observing their traditional hunting practices and unique social customs, like their elaborate ten-day marriage ceremonies, offered us a glimpse into their distinct way of life."

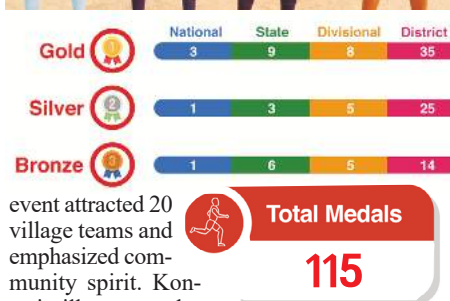
## Lloyds Sports Academy Makes Its Mark on the State Athletic Stage

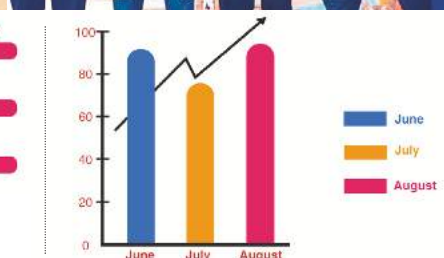

Vikram Mehta, Resident Director. This unique initiative merges traditional healing practices with modern medical care to provide holistic health services to the local community.
- Dr. Prashant Bokare, Vice-Chancellor of Gondwana University, spoke at the event, emphasizing the value of Vedic medicine. He highlighted the effectiveness and minimal side effects of traditional healing methods and called for the recognition and fair compensation of local Vaidus (traditional healers) to preserve their invaluable knowledge.
- In its first phase, the Chikitsalaya will host three local Vaidus—Mr. Katku Pungati, Mr. Soham Bada, and Mr. Somaji Gota—who will serve the community alongside modern medical practitioners. This initiative is part of our broader strategy to provide sustainable healthcare, combining the best of both worlds to enhance the well-being of the region.

### Launch of Ambulance Services in Etapalli: A Lifeline for the Community

- In a separate event, in collaboration with Etapalli Nagar Panchayat, we launched a new ambulance service to meet the emergency medical needs of the Etapalli community. The inauguration ceremony, held at the Etapalli Nagar Panchayat office, was led by Nagar Panchayat President Mrs. Dipayanti Pendam and Lloyds Metals Executive Director Mr. S. Venkateswaran.
- The addition of the ambulance is set to significantly improve access to emergency healthcare services in this remote area, where transportation challenges often delay critical medical care. ## Beyond the Mine: Community Health Initiatives in Villages

We are driving efforts towards healthier villages by combating malaria and other seasonal diseases. Collaborating with CSR teams, Outreach Workers, and Lloyds Kali Ammal Memorial Hospital, regular health checkups, cleanliness awareness camps, and mosquito net distributions are ongoing. Guppy fish are being released into water bodies to reduce mosquito breeding, alongside fogging efforts.

Increased malaria cases in villages like Mallampahadi, Surjagarh, Hedri, Manger, and Godeli have prompted proactive measures, including the treatment of 25 malaria patients at LKAM Hospital. To further promote hygiene, 'Cleanest Home' and 'Cleanest Village' competitions will be introduced to encourage cleanliness and disease prevention.

### 121 Blood Donors Support the Cause at Konsari

Our commitment to saving lives continues with a blood donation camp held on August 1st at LMEL's Konsari Steel Plant. 121 individuals, including company employees and nearby villagers, came together to donate blood, contributing to a noble cause. Supported by Sub District Hospital, Aheri, the donors were recognized with certificates and gifts. The initiative reinforces our dedication to community welfare, with more drives planned throughout the year.

### Sickle Cell Screening Success in Kudri Village

Of the 116 villagers tested, 16 were diagnosed with sickle cell disease, allowing for timely treatment and management. Known for its dedication to professional development, the Foundation has now launched a groundbreaking security guard training program exclusively for women, challenging traditional gender roles and creating new opportunities for local women.

We recently celebrated the successful completion of its first batch of 15 women who underwent a rigorous 36-day training program. Held at Hedri Ground, the passing-out parade and valedictory function honored their achievements and showcased the transformative power of this initiative. Attended by notable dignitaries, the event highlighted the Foundation's un-

wavering commitment to inclusivity, equality, and sustainable development.

The training program was comprehensive, covering essential skills such as security basics, fire safety, communication, and emergency response. The newly trained female security guards have been deployed across various facilities, including the CSR Complex, school, hospital, garment unit, and offices. This initiative not only empowers women but also strengthens the security framework within our campus marking a progressive step towards gender parity in rural communities.

The idea for women's security training emerged from the growing presence of women in our various departments. Recognizing the need for female representation in the security wing, Mr. C. Kumaresan, Director (Project), and Major

Jitender Nagpal, DGM (Security), took the initiative to launch the program. Under the mentorship of Mr. Mohan Gadve, Security Incharge (Grinding Unit and CSR Complex), the first batch of 15 women was rigorously trained.

## Breaking the Silence: Sakhi-Saheli initiative empowering Women

Our CSR team along with the Outreach Workers are on a mission to break the stigma associated with menstrual hygiene and educate local tribal women to use sanitary pads. The program has been named "Sakhi-Saheli". Through the dedicated team efforts of Lloyds Kali Ammal Memorial Hospital, CSR & ORWs team, Village Sarpanchs, Asha Workers, Anganwadi Sevikas and Villagers, this initiative became successful in raising awareness about menstrual health and hygiene in various villages under Etapalli taluka, Gadchiroli. The doctors had a healthy interaction with the women and adolescent girls about managing their health during menstrual cycle & maintaining hygiene. A strong message was given - 'Periods are normal, not shameful and not a thing to hide!'

The team has distributed 2000 sanitary napkins so far across the 10 Outreach Centres covering 21 villages from June to August. This drive will continue in the coming months too. The LIF CSR and ORW team encouraged the women to access these essentials from the ORCs every month. We certainly believe that - Every PERIOD is a Chance to Break the Stigma!

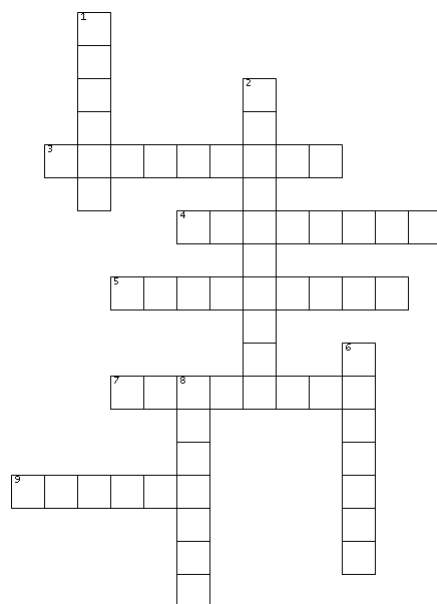
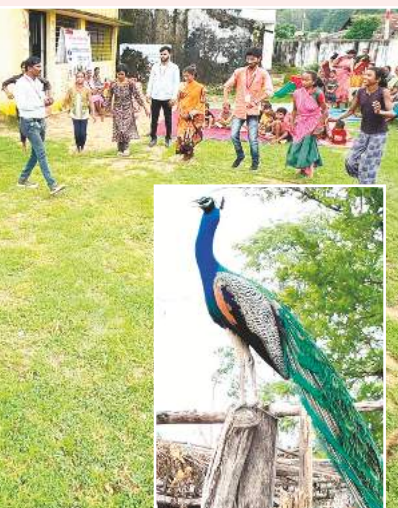
